Cowichan Tribes is the largest First Nation band in British Columbia comprised of seven tradition villages: Kw'a'mutsun, Qw'umiyiqun', Xwulqw'selu, S'amuna, Lhumlhumuluts', Xinupsum and Tl'ulpalus. We have delegated responsibilities to provide Cowichan members services in child and family services, health, housing, membership, fisheries, lands and self-government, and social development.

The Mental Health Counsellor will provide a variety of counselling services to the Cowichan Tribes community within a group, family or individual setting. While providing quality clinical services, you will work with other team members to develop, lead and implement individual or group therapy sessions, mental wellness classes, workshops and other related programming.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Facilitate culturally appropriate healing and recovery utilizing contemporary approaches in the following areas: health and well-being; parental and youth mental health; intergenerational trauma, and addiction recovery support;
- Perform clinical services such as intake, assessment, diagnosis, treatment and crisis intervention;
- Participate in the development, implementation and evaluation of services; attends team / departmental meetings; engage in a variety of committees, groups or events; and maintains professional competence through continued professional development;
- Liaise with a variety to community stakeholders: family; elders; non-profit organizations, other Tse'wulhutun programs and other community service providers as applicable;
- Completes accurate and timely case documentation;
- Other related duties as required.
